

ADDITIONAL ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Since April 1, 2021

- Opened Veterans' Home at Chicago
- Collaboration with IDPH for wastewater surveillance pilot program
- Updated essential policy procedures in collaboration with IDPH and USDVA
- Achieved highest vaccination rate of all state agencies
- Leadership site visits to all homes regularly
- Served 45,000+ veterans in Veteran Service Offices & State-Approving Agency
- Annual report revamped and on time
- Began IDVA strategy development with external consultant



ILLINOIS VETERANS' HOMES



VETERANS' HOME AT CHICAGO

- 200 bed facility all private rooms and bathrooms; Pioneer model
- This \$121 Million facility creates 300 new jobs in the Chicagoland area
- Eleven residents already in the building since January 2022







VETERANS' HOME AT QUINCY



- Working with CDB/USDVA
- 200 new construction jobs in the Quincy community (at project peak)
- \$230 Million invested in the community through the "Rebuild Illinois Program"







FIELD OVERVIEW 2021

Veterans Service Officers had more than 95,605 touchpoints

with veterans through office visits, emails, phone calls, faxes, and events

Accomplishments during FY21

- In-office and remote services
- IDVA University internal training
- Hiring to fill key positions
- Four office moves for accessibility and proximity to veteran populations

- Represented claims in 103 Appeal Hearings
- Established 3,601 new veteran profiles
- Issued 2,685 hunting and fishing licenses and 285 camping fee waivers



SAA OVERVIEW

Accomplishments during FY21

- Covered 1,237 MIA-POW Scholarship claims
- Processed 306 Educational Opportunity Grants
- Maintained the approval of 1,240 education and training facilities.
- Highest possible score achieved on U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs program inspection.






FY23 BUDGET REQUEST
