New Illinois Veterans Home Construction Starts

Thanks to Governor Rauner and the Legislature passing the current Stop Gap budget, the construction of the new Veterans Home at 4350 North Oak Park Avenue in Chicago will restart with an anticipation of construction to be substantially complete in the summer of 2018. The general contractors have been contacted, contracts are being renegotiated and a construction schedule is being finalized.



IVH-Chicago will be the fifth veterans' home in the state. This home will be five stories and include major efforts to harness green energy and construction values as the home will be built to Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver Certification. This is a testament to its energyefficient and environmentally-friendly design, which features single-occupancy rooms with private bathrooms, common areas for dining, resident recreation and areas for visitors and guests.

The property is on 7.8 acres of land at the Southwest Corner of Forest Preserve Drive and Oak Park Avenue, with close proximity to the Edward Hines, Jr. VA Hospital and to public transportation. In addition to rooms for residents requiring skilled care, the home will have 40 long-term care beds for veterans with Alzheimer's disease and dementia. When we are closer to the completion of the new home, we will share information regarding resident applications, transfers and other factors for interested veterans and their families. We have a lot to do and will continue to focus on building the best possible home for our much deserving veterans.



Our mission at the IDVA is very simple. To serve those who have served. In doing so, we serve not only the men and women who have worn the uniform, but also their families. It is our privilege to be able to help our veterans receive the benefits they have earned through service to our nation. Our goal is to empower our veterans and their families to thrive in all aspects of their lives.

★ Gold Star Mother's& Family's Day



Last month we observed and honored all Gold Star Mothers and Gold Star Families with two different programs. Governor Rauner and the First Lady joined the Gold Star Mothers at a solemn and sincere luncheon program in Springfield. The next day, the Governor and Assistant Director Harry Sawyer led a Gold Star Family program in the Rotunda of the Capitol.

Since 1936, the last Sunday in September has been designated as Gold Star Mother's Day to recognize and honor those who have lost a child while serving the country in the United States Armed Forces. The event was the result of legislation passed unanimously in the General Assembly last spring to bring recognition to people who are sometimes forgotten when a member of the military is killed.
