Veterans' Home at LaSalle

The Veterans' Home at LaSalle, located on the northwest side of LaSalle in LaSalle County, offers space for 190 residents including rooms for those requiring memory care. The Home provides medical and skilled nursing care, recreational and rehabilitative therapy, social services and pastoral services. A bank, barber shop, and library are also onsite. Outdoor areas include the commemorative peace garden with a walking path and benches, a garden terrace, and picnic areas.

Illinois Veterans Home LaSalle has a dedicated staff of over 200 staff and contractors, with 35 percent of its staff loyally serving Veterans for more than 10 years, and 20 staff members providing dedicated care for more than 20 years! Its staff is dedicated to the mission of IDVA and its ability to serve our nations' heroes.

Veterans' Home at Manteno

The Veterans' Home at Manteno has welcomed resident veterans since 1986. With an expansive campus set on 122 acres, residents and guests are welcomed by a scenic drive entering beautiful grounds with covered pavilions and a small, serene lake. The Home has space for 304 residents seeking skilled nursing. Amenities include an onsite library, barber and beauty shop, bank, and chapel. Covered porches on the resident buildings give access to all four seasons. Indoor gatherings are held in large Veterans' halls and private visiting areas are available for quiet conversation and family celebrations.

The Veterans' Home at Manteno is an anchor in the community and enjoys a robust volunteer program which allows for special events and programming and keeps the Veterans and its staff connected to the community.

Prince Home: The Prince Home, located on the Manteno campus, is designed for homeless veterans, and engages them in curriculum, programs, and activities. The Home offers 15 Veterans private bedrooms and spaces for building community and developing skills and confidence to gain independent living.

Veterans' Home at Quincy

Founded in 1886, The Veterans' Home at Quincy is Illinois largest and oldest Veterans' home. Steeped in history, it was the original Soldiers and Sailors Home and enjoys 135 years of caring for Veterans and a strong connection to the Quincy community. 300 Veterans and their spouses reside at the Home in domiciliary, intermediate, skilled, and memory care. The Veterans' Home at Quincy is currently undergoing a \$230 million construction enhancement project to upgrade and replace many of its aging buildings and provide upgraded amenities to its residents.

Residents have access to a full complement of medical staff, theraputic heated pool, full-service therapy team, restaurant, bank, post office, chapel, historical museum, commemorative memorials, and a self-sufficient library.

The beautifully maintained and cared for grounds reflect the commitment to care for the Home. The Home promotes a nurturing culture of excellence of care and goes to great lengths to accommodate the vast array of needs of Veterans and spouses in their care.

The Illinois Veterans' Home at Anna, located in Anna-Jonesboro in Union County, opened in 1994 and offers space to 50 resident veterans in skilled nursing and space for 12 residents in six adjoining apartment domiciliary units.

The home is situated on 16 scenic acres which offer vistas, fishing pond, and walking paths. A lush outdoor garden is a quiet space for residents to read, sit, and visit.
